STAYING SAFE THIS SUMMER



Studies show that teens are more likely to try marijuana, alcohol or other drugs during summer months. Here are three tips to help reduce the chance your child will engage in risky behaviors this summer:

1) **Make a List of What They Can Do Without Asking Permission** - Talk with your teen about the kinds activities they may do without your explicit permission. The condition is they leave a note or send you a text that tells where they are going, what they are doing, with whom, when and the estimated time of return.

2) **Install Computer Controls** - With some 200 million websites, letting your teen know that you are adding controls and a history tracker can help. This allows you to check (and let them know you are checking) where they have been online.

3) **Know What is in the Cabinet**

Track the alcohol you have in the house-whether it's in the fridge, garage or wine cellar. With teenagers abusing pain medication, it's also important to monitor and secure all prescriptions as well as dispose of all expired medications.
